

Need help completing your Free Application for Federal Student Aid?



The Lynchburg Beacon of Hope is hosting three virtual FAFSA Night events on Tuesdays in October. All events begin at 5:30 p.m. Register at the link below.





To complete a FAFSA, a student will need the following:

- 2020 household tax information
- 1 parent's date of birth, social security number, and phone or email access
- the student's date of birth, social security number, and phone or personal email access

Attendance for Virtual Virginia (grades 6-12 only)

If your student takes a course in Virtual Virginia, please be sure to review the updated attendance requirements that were sent to your parent email on record. Updates include:


- Students are required to access their asynchronous content Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.
- Students are required to attend synchronous instruction settings or, if unable to attend the synchronous session, watch the session in the Course Video Library.
- If a student does not log into their Virtual Virginia account for four consecutive instructional days, they will receive a "no login or activity" warning message.
- After a second period of 4 consecutive instructional days of no activity, the student will be withdrawn from the course.

Please note: This is a Virtual Virginia update. Student attendance is still taken separately through the Virtual Academy processes that we have been using, including the daily check-in link for high school students and the daily attendance in homeroom for middle school students.

Science at the Virtual Academy










